MBS, like all of Colchester, is experiencing a large number of Spongy moths which recently hatched. Newly hatched caterpillars spin a thin silk-like thread that allows them to blow in the wind and land on other trees, structure, and unfortunately, people. We literally had caterpillars falling from tree branches last week causing some distress and itchy rashes on many students and staff.



These tiny caterpillars don't bite. The rash is caused from their tiny hairs (called setae). Not everyone is sensitive to these hairs, but some people react with a very itchy/stinging, annoying rash. Students were experiencing the rash on their neck, arms, and sometimes legs.

If your child is experiencing a rash from these annoying critters, here are some tips for management at home:

- Check clothing when coming in from outdoors and remove any caterpillars
- Wash any exposed areas with soap and water
- Apply cold compresses, calamine lotion, or hydrocortisone cream
- Consult your child's pediatrician if the rash does not improve after 2-3 days, or it's significant and causing a lot of itching or distress.
