Our Teachers




- * 100% of Malletts Bay Teachers are "highly qualified"

- * Malletts Bay teachers serve as mentors for student teachers from both St. Michael's College and the University of Vermont



Smarter Balanced Test Results: Math




Health Services

- * 310 Students were screened for basic vision/hearing
- * 26 of those were referred for further evaluation
- * 11 students receive prescription medication at school
- * 9 students have chronic health conditions requiring ongoing medical care and monitoring
- * 39 students have a health plan administered by the school nurse

Reading

- * Locally developed curriculum based on Common Core
- * Effective strategies for reading literature, technical, and informational text
- * Leveled books, online reading, and short articles
- * 60 Minutes daily, with 30 minutes for focused basic skill instruction
- * Ongoing formative assessments
- * Supported by one Title I teacher, four special educators, and one literacy coach



Mathematics



- * Core program: <u>Everyday</u> <u>Mathematics</u>
- * Includes paper and pencil and online resources
- * 60 Minutes daily with 30 minutes for focused instruction in basic skills
- * Ongoing assessments to monitor progress
- * Supported by one Title I teacher, four special educators, and one math coach

Writing, Science and Social Studies

- * Writing closely aligned with reading instruction
- * Craft and technique for three genres: narrative, informational, and opinion
- * Writing embedded in social studies and science
- * Looking forward to developing new science units based on the "Next Generation" science standards
- * 45 minutes daily for science and social studies in alternating quarters
- * 50-60 minutes daily for writing

Technology and Community Support

- * Active parent partnerships
- High rates of homework completion and daily attendance
- * PTO raises funds for field trips and other enrichment
- * Parents run the Four Winds program during school day
- Odyssey of the Mind after school program is parent run
- Close collaboration with Colchester Recreation's ACE before/after school program

- 2 students per one device
- Primarily Chromebooks with some desktops and lpads
- Mobile cart of Chromebooks for each house
- Small mini-lab for specialized instructional needs
