The school board heard a proposal on November 16, 2021, pertaining to the relocation of the Central Office to 59 Rathe Road in Colchester and for the renovation of the existing central office building to become the new Colchester Alternative Program ("CAP") building. The estimated construction costs for the new CAP building were between \$250K and \$350K as presented. However, during the presentation there was concern shared that the likelihood of the actual bids would come in at the high end or higher due primarily to supply chain issues.

We sent out request for proposals to several vendors and received two back. Both contractors have agreed to provide the same service. In fact, as it pertains to the plumbing and HVAC work, both companies had planned to use the same subcontractor. The bids came in close. The funds to pay for this project would come from primarily the capital reserve account.

Farrington Construction Company, Inc.	\$436,500

The companies shown in the table above can complete the project in a timely manner and within the desired specifications of the district assuming limited supply chain issues. Wright & Morrissey, Inc. has come in with the best price. We have collaborated with Wright & Morrissey on projects in the past with excellent results. I recommend selecting Wright & Morrissey for this project.

The Colchester Board of Education held a regular board meeting on Tuesday, March 15, 2022, in the Colchester High School Library. Board members in attendance were Directors Lindsey Cox, Nic Longo, Ben Yousey-Hindes, Laurie Kigonya, Felix Anderson, and Student Representative Gloria Kigonya. District administrators in attendance included Superintendent Amy Minor, Business and Operations Manager George Trieb, Director of Curriculum Gwendolyn Carmolli, and Director of Student Support Services Carrie Lutz. District employees included Preschool Facilitator Nancy Smith and Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Coordinator Jamilah Vogel. There were no audience members.

I. Call to Order & Pledge of Allegiance

Superintendent Amy Minor called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. and led in the Pledge of Allegiance.

II. Citizen Participation

None.

III. Hear Nominations for School Board Reorganization and Approval of Newspaper of Record

Action

Nominations were held for school board chair, vice chair, and clerk, as well as the official newspaper of record.

Director Longo moved to nominate Lindsey Cox as Board Chair, seconded by Director Kigonya. The motion passed unanimously, 4-0.

Director Yousey-Hindes moved to nominate Nic Longo as Vice Chair, seconded by Director Kigonya. The motion passed unanimously, 4-0.

Director Longo moved to nominate Ben Yousey-Hindes as Board Clerk, seconded by Director Kigonya. The motion passed unanimously, 4-0.

Director Yousey-Hindes moved to approve The Colchester Sun as the official newspaper for the district for legal notices. The motion passed unanimously, 5-0.

IV. Black Lives Matter Flag

Action

In December, at the request of students, the school board approved flying the Black Lives Matter (BLM) flag at all schools for three months per the district's Flagpole Request Policy. With the flag nearing the end of the three-month period, students from the Social Justice Alliance Clubs at Colchester Middle School and Colchester High School wrote a letter to the board requesting that the board continue flying the BLM flag at schools in the district. Board Chair Cox read the letter aloud.

The letter urged the board and community members to recognize the significance that the flag has for minority students. Student Board Representative Gloria Kigonya added that the Student Justice Alliance recently had a popup table at the high school with shirts that read, "we are all human". It was very successful and there was overwhelming student support; they ran out of shirts in less than an hour.

Director Longo moved to raise the Black Lives Matter flag at all CSD schools for an additional three months beginning on Tuesday, April 5, 2022 through Tuesday, July 5, 2022. The motion passed unanimously.

V. Hear Preschool Presentation

Information

Director of Student Support Services, Carrie Lutz, and Early Education Program Facilitator, Nancy Smith, provided the board and community with an overview of the CSD Preschool Program. The presentation highlighted the importance and benefits of early education, preschool requirements from the AOE, curriculum, staffing, enrollment, outreach, and facility needs. The board asked some additional questions about enrollment, assessment and transition data, as well as details and logistics of the outreach services provided by the preschool special education team.

The calendar is based on the contract agreement which indicates there will be 176 student days, 8 in-service days, 1 teacher prep day, and 2 family conference days for a total of 187 days. Also included on the calendar were four early release days. Superintendent Minor stated the early release days continue to be a success for professional development. She also noted that Colchester Parks and Recreation agreed to continue to offer childcare for K-5 students.

Director Kigonya moved to approve the four early release days in the 2022-2023 calendar as presented. The motion passed unanimously.
