I would like to extend a sincere 'thank-you' to the families of MBS. I know this year has been so challenging, and I appreciate your diligence in keeping sick kids home, picking them up from school when they aren't feeling well, and getting covid tests so they can return quickly.

Here are some of the most frequently asked questions I get this year!

Q: Does my child need a Covid test? **A:** Generally, if your child has any symptoms (Yes, even a runny nose) that last longer than 24 hours, they should get a Covid test before returning to school. You can always contact me or your child's pediatrician if you're unsure.

Q: Where can I get a test? **A:** I direct most families to the Vermont Department of Health pop-up sites. They have locations on Malletts Bay Ave in Winooski, Pine Street in Burlington, and a new location at the CHC on North Winooski Ave in Burlington. You can walk-in, but to avoid the wait it's best to schedule an appointment online. Results have been coming back after about 36 hours. You do not need a doctors order to test at these locations, and can go even if you are sick. More information about test sites and to pre-register for an appointment can be found [here](#).

Q: Once my child has a negative test, when can they return to school?

A: Students can return when they have been fever-free for 24 hours (without fever reducing medication) and their symptoms are improved. Please let me know if they tested, and their test results.

Q: My child's sibling is quarantined from an exposure at school, can they still go to school? **A:** Yes, only the sibling who is a close contact needs to quarantine. Other children in the household can continue to go to school. If the quarantined sibling becomes ill, then I would advise keeping your other children home from school until the quarantined sibling get tested.
